1. Ball's Mill Lot 8, Conc. 3 9334 McDougall Rd.	c.1842	A good example of a mill in neo-classical style of the mid 19 th Century.
2. Sowden House Beaver Meadow Farm Lot 34, Conc. 2 7115 Dale Rd.	1839	A good example of a house in neo-classical style of the mid 19 th Century.
3. McIntosh House/ Beedham House Lot 16, Conc. 5 3784 Burnham St.	c.1860	A mid 19 th Century classical revival style frame cottage.
4. Lacey/Bickle "Bell Farm" Lot 23, Conc. 4 3414 Lacey Road	c.1870	A later 19 th Century farm house.
5. Burnham/Foster Lot 18, Conc. 2 8472 Danforth Rd.	c.1821	A fine early example of the neo-classical style in frame.
6. Scott/Henderson Castle Hill House Lot 16, Conc. 2 8582 Danforth Rd. W.	c.1850	Excellent example of a Regency Style Country House of 1849.
7. Old Camborne School House Lot 20, Conc. 4 3441 Alberts Alley	1895	Good example of a one room school which has not been converted to a residence.
8. Westington/ Cooper House Lot 25, Concession 6 4056 Art Lang Rd.	1877	An 1877 storey and half red brick house with original cedar shake roof.

9. Cruikshank/Watt House Lot 12, Conc. 8 8972 Oak Ridges Dr.	c.1873	Good example of an Ontario Vernacular Style Home with Bell Cast Verandah Roof of Circa 1875.
10. Fisher/Dorion House Lot 6, Conc. 5 3745 Harwood Rd.	c.1850	An excellent example of a single storey hip roof building of plank wall frame construction in a single family home.
11. Frost House Lot 16, Conc. 5 3826 Burnham St. N.	1839	A good example of a neo-classical house of the 1830's.
12. Glen Lynden House Lot 17, Conc. 9 8548 Glen Lynden Rd.	c.1875	A good example of a late 19 th Century Regency Style House.
13. Halfway House Lot 4, Conc. 1 9592 Danforth Rd. E.	c.1810	A good example of a wilderness Georgian House of the early 19 th Century.
14. Jackson/McKillop House Lot 26, Conc. 8 4935 Halstead Beach Rd.	1879	A mid 19 th Century Ontario Vernacular two-storey brick farm house.
15. Hartwick House Lot 15, Conc. 5 3756 Burnham St. N.	c.1865	Good example of a late 19 th Century Classical revival Farm House
16. Harwood School House Lot 4, Conc. 9 5295 Old Schoolhouse Rd.	1871	A good example of a mid 19 th Century frame school house in the classical style.
17. Homewood House Lot 26, Conc. 1 7834 County Rd. 2	1867	A good example of a triple red brick farm house with Regency Style features.
18. Hummel House Lot 15, Conc. 9 5257 Kelly Road	c.1855	A good example of a classical Revival Style house of the mid 19 th Century.
19. Gifford House Lot 27, Conc. 1 7694 County Rd. 2	c.1875	A good example of a storey and a half, red brick Ontario Classical Farm House.

20. Pratt/Sharpe House Lot 14, Conc. 9 5296 Rice Lake Sc. Dr.	c.1870	A good example of a 1920's Arts and Crafts Style House and the historically significant Fred Pratt Boatworks building.
21. Westington/Lang House Part Lot 31, Conc. 7 4664 Little Rd. N.	c.1896	A good example of a late 19 th Century farm house circa 1896.
22. Lilac Lodge Lot 15, Conc. 9 8675 Lampman Lane	1848 & c1899	A good example of an Ontario Classic Style with Georgian symmetry and is one of the earliest original houses remaining in Gores Landing.
23. Mavis Bank/Harris House Lot 15, Conc. 9 8676 Lampman Lane	c.1848	A good example of a Regency Cottage built in 1848.
24. McBride/Weeks House Lot 15, Conc. 9 5257 Plank Rd.	c. 1855	The white framed, one and a half storey house is a typical Ontario Classic Style with gothic gable Window above the centre bay and Verandahs on three sides and much of the original window glazing survives.
25. Henderson/McGillis House Lot 22, Conc. 8 4885 L. Westington Rd.	c.1864	A circa 1864 fieldstone house of the Ontario Classic Style.
26. Mock House Lot 16, Concession 5 3778 Burnham St. N.	1875	A good example of a Brick Ontario Cottage built in 1875.
27. New Lodge Farm Lot 6, Conc. B 9421 County Rd. 2	1829	A good example of a Regency House of the early 19 th Century together with the coach house and stable.
28. Pickering Hotel Lot 19, Conc. 3 4903 County Rd. 45	1854	A good example of a late mid-19 th Century hotel.
29. Plainville United Church Lot 19, Conc. 7 8372 Cavan Rd.	1903	A good example of a turn of the Century gothic style brick church.

30. Ravenscourt Lot 33, Conc. 1 7203 Dr. Johnson Rd.	c. 1847	A good example of a mid-19 th Century Classical Revival country house of provincial significance.
31. Renwood Farm Lot 19, Conc. 2 1459 Ontario St.	c.1870	A good example of an Italianate Villa of the mid 19 th Century.
32. Ash/Ryckman House Lot 7, Conc. 1 9340 Danforth Rd. E.	1835	A good example of a fine early neo-classical in frame and stone.
33. Sacred Heart Church Lot 4, Conc. 9 9606 Queen St.	1884	A good example of a late victorian modest style Church of the 1884 era for the exterior of the building only.
34. Sheffield House Part Lots 3 and 53 Plan 23, Conc. 2 4863 Highway 45	c.1850	A good example of a neo-classical style with the front and sides of this storey and a half this storey and a half frame structure has six over six windows and returning eaves on the gable ends with the front door having side lights and pilasters.
35. St. Ann's Anglican Church Lot 34, Conc. 8 5078 Pine Street	1901	A good example of a small 19 th Century Church.
36. St. John's Anglican Church Lot 4, Conc. 9 9595 Queen St.	1876	A good example of a 19 th Century Gothic Revival Style Church.
37. St. George's Cemetery Lot 15, Conc. 9 8661 Church Hill Rd.	1847	An important early Cemetery.
38. St. George's Church Lot 15, Conc. 9 8661 Church Hill Rd.	1847	A good example of an exceptional stone church of the turn of the Century.
39. St. George's Rectory Lot 15, Conc. 9 8661 Church Hill Rd.	1926	A good example of the Craftsman's Style of the early 20 th Century.

40. Huntley/Dale Farm Smart/Turnbal House Lot 12, Conc. 8 5139 Lew Harris Rd.	1921	A good example of a two storey brick farm house with a hip roof typical of the 1920's era.
41. Victoria Inn/The Willows Lot 14, Conc. 9 5316 Rice Lake Scenic Dr.	1902	Excellent example of a gracious turn of the Century Shingle Style summer home. It was clad in clapboard with shingled gables and octagonal tower. The oculus windows and eyebrow dormers are typical of this style of home. A wide two storey verandah with Bell curved roof overlooks Rice Lake.
42. Waldon/Halligan House Lot 15, Conc. 8 5141 Kelly Rd.	1892	A good example of the late Victorian farm dwelling.
43. Isaac Waddington House Lot 15, Conc. 9 (2 nd part 1882-84) 5239 Kelly Road	c.1850	A good example of the picturesque style in brick and wood.
44. The White House Lot 15, Conc. 9 5290 Kelly Road	1854	A good example imposing rough-cast Regency Style villa with three storey verandahs on three sides possesses Classical Revival features such as square plan, hip roof, high cellar walls and high ceilings in the two principal storeys.
45. Hill Top Farm/Runlet Lot 10, Conc. 2 2642 Cap Wilson Rd.	1800	A classic example of a house built in the mid 1800's.
46. Hallworth House Lot 26, Conc. 3 7823 Bickle Hill Rd.	c1861 & 1907	An excellent example of the precision cutting and fitting of the stone in the foundation; upstairs Gothic window in the back section which dates to the 1850-1860's; the semi circular, colourful, stained glass window in the living room (north wall); the interior woodwork in the vestibule, curved staircase and upper landing bannister, which are unusually ornate and fine for a turn of the century working farmhouse; and the interior door and window mouldings in the downstairs are quite interesting because of their complex shapes that are very hand-labour intensive.
