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INTRODUCTION

Purpose

The primary focus of this inspection is to confirm compliance with Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) legislation as well as evaluating conformance with ministry drinking water policies and guidelines during the inspection period.

Scope

The ministry utilizes a comprehensive, multi-barrier approach in the inspection of water systems that focuses on the source, treatment, and distribution components as well as management and the operation of the system.

The inspection of the drinking water system included both the physical inspection of the component parts of the system listed in section 4 "Systems Components" of the report and the review of data and documents associated with the operation of the drinking water system during the review period.

This drinking water system is subject to the legislative requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act, 2002 (SDWA) and regulations made therein, including Ontario Regulation 170/03, "Drinking Water Systems" (O. Reg. 170/03). This inspection has been conducted pursuant to Section 81 of the SDWA.

This inspection report does not suggest that all applicable legislation and regulations were evaluated. It remains the responsibility of the owner to ensure compliance with all applicable legislative and regulatory requirements.

Facility Contacts and Dates

The drinking water system is owned by The Corporation of The Township of Hamilton and at the time of the inspection was operated by the Lakefront Utility Services Inc (LUSI).

The system serves an estimated population of 357 and is categorized as a Class 1 Distribution System. Information reviewed for this inspection covered the time period of June 27, 2024 through to May 27, 2025. The physical inspection was performed on May 27 2025. Adam Taggart, Manager, Water Operations Ryan Smith, Operator and Jordan Price, Operator, all from Lakefront Utility Services Inc., were present during the inspection.

Systems/Components

The Hamilton Township Distribution System (Hamilton TWP DS) includes 14 Fire Hydrants and 36 valves (main and hydrant). There are no storage, pressure boosting, re-chlorination facilities,



or other external structures associated with Hamilton Township DS.

This drinking water system was subject to specific conditions contained within the following permissions and/or approvals (please note this list is not exhaustive) at the time of the inspection in addition to the requirements of the SDWA and its regulations:

Distribution system chlorine residuals were measured at the June Ave. sampling station by the Lakefront Utility Services operation staff each week using a hand-held analyzer. The sample test results were recorded in the operation logs.

Secondary disinfection chlorine residuals ranged from 0.51 mg/L to 1.35 mg/L at the June Ave sampling station during the inspection period.
